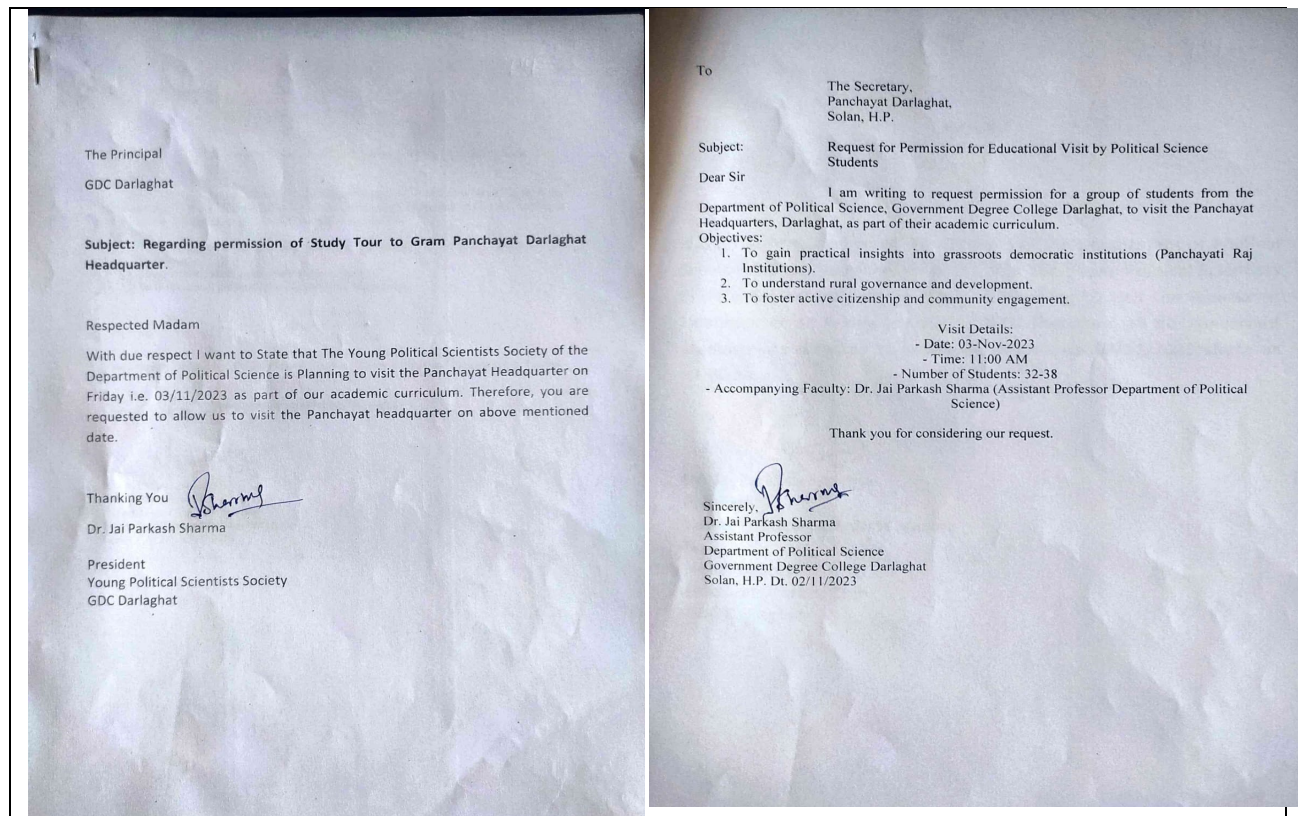



Digital Literacy Survey Report

Introduction:

We, the students of GDC Darlaghat, conducted a survey to understand digital literacy among our college students. We wanted to know how well students use technology and what challenges they face.

Methodology:

- Sample Size: 80 students from our college
- Questionnaire: We used a simple questionnaire (attached)

Findings:

Section 1: About You

- Age: all are between 18-22 years old.
- Gender: 80% female, 20% male
- Location: 70% live in villages, 30% in Darlaghat(Semi-Rural)

Section 2: Access to Technology

- Devices Owned: 75% have smartphones, 40% have computers/laptops
- Internet Connection: 100% use mobile data
- Internet Reliability: 50% rated their connection as average

Section 3: Digital Skills

- Basic Skills: 80% can browse the internet, 70% use social media
- Intermediate Skills: 40% can create documents, 30% use spreadsheets
- Advanced Skills: 20% make presentations

Section 4: Challenges

- Barriers to Digital Literacy: 60% said poor internet connection, 50% lack of training/resources
- Training Programs: Only 20% attended digital skills training

Section 5: Awareness and Suggestions

- Resources: 40% know about online learning resources
- Training Needs: 60% want basic computer skills training
- Importance of Digital Literacy: 80% rated it as very important for future jobs

Conclusion:

Our survey shows that while many students have access to technology, they face challenges like poor internet and lack of training. Improving digital literacy is crucial for education and future careers.

Recommendations:

1. Improve internet connectivity
2. Provide basic computer skills training
3. Raise awareness about online learning resources

Limitations:

- Small sample size
- Limited geographical area

BOOK REVIEW

History is deeply connected with literature. Literature of any age, has rightly been called a mirror of the society. Even a work of fiction cannot appear out of vacuum. It must have a historical background. Thus, literature proves to be an important source for historical reconstruction. It enriches our understanding of nuances of past in a way that conventional histories based on bureaucratic accounts cannot. Therefore, it an activity of book review was planned for the third-year students.

The third-year students of History were given a choice between two books:

1. The Diary of a Young Girl, by Anne Frank
2. Animal Farm, by George Orwell

The first book is a poignant account of a Jewish family trapped in a secret hiding in Amsterdam during the age of Nazism and the Second World War. While the second book is a witty rendition of Communist Revolution in Russia and rise of an autocratic state under Stalin in its aftermath.

This activity was kept voluntary in nature. Six students: Himani Sharma, Karan Kumar, Geeta Devi, Nainsi, Ankita Sharma, and Nikita each read one of the books and submitted the book reviews. The best two have been attached for reference.

The books were provided to the students by the department. A lengthy discussion was also held on the themes of war, peace, communism, Nazism, autocracies etc., during the class, facilitated by students themselves. It is hoped that such an activity will generate a deeper historical understanding and an increased interest in reading books.

When Animals Revolted against Humans

Animal farm by George Orwell is a simple tale of animals overthrowing some farmers for their own control, but through this simple concept, Orwell manages to depict the path from revolution "to all out" corruption. The book presents itself as an allegory of animals on a farm that overthrew the humans in control, and attempt to create a society based on utmost equality and fairness between the animals. However as time passes, the equality diminishes and class and status divides and isolates the different animals.

The book is very well written and it presents an easier way to understand communism and why it failed in the post-war USSR, without the need of learning and possessing the knowledge of communist history. Apart from history, the book is, in essence a study of human nature and how ideals do not always uphold in face of reality. It is a compelling reminder of the corrupting nature of power and why it must be checked.

This book is an excellent example of proper fictional writing that serves as a way to explain great events in history. Orwell finds a way to explain the ultimate downfall of communism in a light - hearted fairy tale manner.
