Assignments will be given in two cycles:

- 1. For DSC I (First Year), DSC III (Second Year), DSE I (Third Year), SEC I (Second Year), and SEC V (Third Year), assignment will be given in the last week of August and collected in last week of September
- 2. For DSC II (First Year), DSC IV (Second Year), DSE III (Third Year), SEC III (Second Year), and SEC VII (Third Year), assignment will be given in the last week of October and collected in last week of November.
- **3.** Assignments in Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will be designed in a way such that they **encourage field visits**, **surveys and reports etc.**

Teaching Method:

- 1. In addition to **conventional lecture method**, an attempt will be made to employ methods that include more student interaction both with the teacher and with the peers.
- 2. Saturdays will be reserved for activities that encompass the idea of 'learning-by-doing.' This will entail activities like quizzes, discussions, debates, enactment of historical episodes (role-play), drawing up historical timelines, and/or screening of a relevant documentary/historical movie.
- 3. **Blended-teaching methods** will be employed as far as possible for example through screening of documentaries, and teaching through PPTs.
- 4. **Flipped class method** will be employed through presentations, debates and other class activities.

Internal Assessment:

In addition to a **class test** and a **home assignment** and **MTT** for each course, **other methods** will be employed to ensure **continuous learning and assessment** throughout the session.

- **1. Quiz**: Regular quizzes will be held in each class. Two-four quizzes may be held throughout the session.
- **2. Debates**: Debates are a great way to engage students, encourage critical thinking, and assess the learning stage of students. While class tests and quizzes test if student has reached the

remembering and understanding stage of learning, an activity like debate tests memory, understanding, application and analyses of information so gathered. One or two debates on a critical historical theme may be held in the session.

3. Presentations: Attempt will be made to hold regular presentations, for example after completion of each topic, or during submission of assignment. This will ensure that assignments are not mere reproduction of information without understanding. Cross-questioning will be an essential part of such presentations.

Both debates and presentations will be based on concept of 'flipped learning'.

- **4. Creative Activities:** Another way to test learning is through encourage original thinking by engaging students in creative activities for example **cartooning or poster making** on historical themes. This will encourage students to think about history in a new way, perhaps as a contemporary observer would.
- **5. Book Reviews:** Students will be encouraged to read books of history/ related to historical themes other than those prescribed in syllabus. Writing book reviews of such books then will aid in improving comprehension and understanding of such themes.

Tentative plan for Educational Trips:

As per HPU guidelines, a visit to a museum/archaeological site/archive/craft exhibition/art gallery/architectural site etc., is an essential component of the Skill-enhancement Course (SEC). Based on the course syllabus, an educational trip can be organized to any one or both of the following places/events (the best nearby), preferably in October-November 2024/
