STUDENT FEEDBACK 2024-25

ANALYSIS REPORT

The student feedback form had 18 questions in all and was designed to cover all major concerns of students including course content, evaluation process, classroom interaction, teaching-learning, college administration, infrastructure and support. Following is a brief report of the feedback received.

- Total responses received: 88
- 69.3% students agree that course curriculum is helpful in overall development of students. While 21.7% disagree, another 9% are neutral.
- 59.5% of students feel that skill enhancement courses studied by them are suitable and updated, 20.3% are neutral, and 20% disagree.
- 64.1% students agree that evaluation process for each course is good, 15.4% are neutral, and another 19.5% disagree.
- 69.3% students agree that their subject teachers take classes regularly, 9% are neutral, and 21.8% disagree.
- 74.3% students feel that the teachers encourage interaction in classrooms, while 21.7% disagree.
- 73% students agree that teachers encourage students to ask questions and clear doubts effectively, while almost 22% students disagree.
- 64.5% students agree that their subject teacher is easily accessible outside the classroom, 14% are neutral, and around 21% disagree.
- More than 70% students said that the syllabus was completed well in time, 7.5% are neutral and nearly 20% disagree.
- Approximately 70% students give a high overall assessment to their subject teachers, 7.6% are neutral and another 20% have disagreed.
- Nearly 98% students find the educational and general ambience of the college good to excellent.
- About 98% of students find the physical infrastructure of the college to be good.
- About 98% of students find that the college office staff is supportive.
- 99% of students find that the college website is updated and well maintained.
- With respect to classroom infrastructure, 89% students find it good to excellent, while 10% feel it is okay and 15.4% feel that it is poor.
- About 94% students feel that the college has provided adequate drinking water facility.
- More than 90% of students have said that cleanliness and maintenance of college premises is good to excellent.

Conclusion

The student feedback collected from 88 respondents provides a comprehensive overview of the academic and infrastructural experience at the college. Most students expressed satisfaction with the curriculum, teaching practices, and institutional support, with over 69% affirming that the curriculum aids in their overall development and more than 70% appreciating the regularity of classes and classroom interaction. Infrastructure and administrative services emerged as strong points, with nearly 98–99% of students satisfied with the college's ambience, physical facilities, office staff, and website maintenance.

However, the feedback also highlighted areas for improvement. Around 20% of students raised concerns about the evaluation process, teacher accessibility, and timely syllabus completion.

Suggestions included improving washroom and classroom cleanliness, establishing a playground, and enhancing canteen facilities. The most frequently cited academic concern was the need to fill the vacant post of the sociology teacher. Overall, the feedback serves as a constructive guide for the institution to build on its strengths and address the identified gaps, ensuring a more engaging and supportive learning environment for all students.
