ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Government Degree College, Darlaghat, District Solan is situated on the Shimla-Bilaspur-Kangra Highway, just over a kilometre ahead of the Darlaghat Bus Stop, towards Bilaspur. It over looks the charming and picturesque Darla hills.

The College was established on 23rd May, 2017, with a view to make quality higher education accessible in Darlaghat and its surrounding regions. It is currently being run in a privately hired complex. The College has already acquired 43.1 bighas of land in village Kotla-Pujariyan and Kotla-Numhal on the Darla Hill. In addition, administrative approval of Rupees 14.56 crore has been granted for construction of a new College campus. All codal formalities having been completed, the construction has already started.

Darlaghat is a sub-teshil and a panchayat of Solan District. Interestingly, it derives its name from "*Dadu*", a wild sour pomegranate, prolific in the area. It is primarily known for Dadu fruit, and limestone resources. In addition, Darlaghat Wildlife Sanctuary was established in 1974, known for hosting population of black bears, sambhars, wild boars, leopard, and various migratory birds. Ambuja Cement Factory, established in 1995, is the economic lifeline of the region. It has facilitated development of a vibrant market network in the region. As a result, the region is also host to a substantial migrant population.

What lends a peculiar distinctiveness to Darlaghat, is its 'Rurban' nature. Just beyond the highway, the factory, and the market, one will find the fields lush with the maize crop, the cows lazily grazing on hay, and the familiar sight of the hardworking Indian farmers. There is a certain solace in the very nature of Darlaghat, a mixture of a town and a village. Government Degree College, Darlaghat is a leap forward in fulfilling the vision of providing affordable and accessible quality higher education to all. The institution primarily serves rural areas, but is well connected to urban facilities, by virtue of its location on National Highway and nearness to the Ambuja Cement factory.

From the very beginning, 70-80 per cent of its students have been girls, a fact which represents both a responsibility and an opportunity to shape the future of these young girls, who are driven to learn, but for various hurdles are unable to go to major cities for their education. 2. SCHEME FOR CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) IN B.A./B. Com

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) adopted under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) provides an opportunity for the students to study courses (from the prescribed courses) according to their choice. Under this system the courses are measured in terms of credits. Credit is a method to measure the volume of content, learning effort, achievement of learning and weightage of the course. The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course usually in terms of instructional hours per week assigned to it. For purpose of credit determination, one lecture or tutorial of one hour a week or practical of two hours a week is considered as one credit. Himachal Pradesh University and its affiliated colleges have implemented new CBCS, as framed by UGC, since the academic year 2016-17 and presently merged in annual system by HPU from academic year 2018-19. In the present system a student is required to attain/ secure 132 credits in three-year degree course across different courses/ papers to become eligible for the award of under graduate degree.

2.1 Outline of Choice Based Credit System

1. Core Course: A course, which should be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a core course. In this category 4 discipline specific courses each for DSC-1 & DSC-2 and four courses of languages (2 of English and 2 of Hindi) are to be studied in 1st and 2nd Year.

2. Elective Course: A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/ subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency is called an Elective Course.

a. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective courses. In this category 2 each for regular courses are to be studied by a student in the 3rd Year.

- b. Dissertation/ Project: Introducing research component in under-graduate courses, dissertation/ project work is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analysing/ exploring a real-life situation/ difficult problem. A Project/ Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective course of 6 credits.
- c. Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/ subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond disciplines of choice is called a Generic Elective. In this category two such courses are to be studied in third year.

Note: A core course offered in a discipline/ subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice-versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) may be of two kinds:

- a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): The AECC courses are based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They are mandatory for all disciplines. The AECCs include:
 - i. Environment Science
 - ii. English/ Hindi/ MIL Communication
- b. Ability Enhancement Elective Courses (AEEC): The AEEC courses (known as Skill Enhancement Courses-SEC) are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses, specific to the main discipline, designed to provide value-based and /or skill-based knowledge and should contain theory and lab/hands-on/ training /field fieldwork. Four such courses are to be studied by students in their 2nd and 3rd year.

5. GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

5.1 Eligibility for Admission

A candidate will be eligible for admission to the First Year of the three-year degree course if he/she fulfils the eligibility conditions as prescribed by HPU Shimla, which are subject to amendment from time to time. In general:

1. A candidate should have passed 10+2 examination conducted by HP Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto by HP University, Shimla.

2. For admission to First Year, an applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl students) as on 01-07-2024. The upper age limit for SC/ST candidates is 26 years. However, the Vice Chancellor, HPU Shimla in exceptional circumstances, to be recorded in writing, may allow a relaxation in age up to a period of six months.

3. The students having compartment in 10+2 class are not eligible for admission.

5.2 Admission Procedure

- 1. Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis and fulfilment of eligibility conditions.
- 2. To apply for admission, candidates should visit the admission portal on the college website at <u>www.gdcdarlaghat.edu.in</u>. Follow the instructions carefully and fill the online application form, upload the required documents, and submit through the portal only. Applications and documents submitted/uploaded only on the admission portal of the College will be accepted. **No application/ document sent on college or any other mail is acceptable.**
- 3. In the course of the admission process, students can approach members of the admission committee. In addition, to facilitate students, the Galaxy Print Studio, a cybercafé is functional within the College campus and adequate instructions have been given to the studio to aid students throughout the admission process.
- Students require an E-mail ID to create an account on our admission portal for online admissions. For second- and third-year students existing E-mail ID, used for admission, is required for roll on admission.
- 5. A student applying for admission in B.A. 1st year is advised to give two subjects/courses of her/his choice, choosing at least one course from any two of the three groups. A candidate has to choose two subjects from the list (page no. 16), as DSC I and DSC II. Both DSC I and DSCII cannot be opted from the same group.

- 6. The application form is to be filled up by the applicant after reading all the instructions, rules and eligibility conditions. The submission of application form for admission shall imply that the applicant is familiar with admission rules and code of conduct in the college and has agreed to abide by the same.
- 7. Subject wise merit list will be displayed on the college website and the college notice board on the scheduled dates.
- 8. The admission forms of the candidates appearing in the merit list will be scrutinized online by the concerned Admission Committee.
- 9. The admission form recommended by the Admission Committee and approved by the Principal entitles a student to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
- 10. Roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per rules of H.P. University, Shimla.
- Incomplete admission forms and those without copies of uploaded documents will not be entertained.
- 12. Every student seeking admission to any class will be required to pay a sum of ₹500/per annum towards PTA fund (non-refundable). However, in case of more than one child of the same parents, PTA fund will be charged from one of the student's subject to production of valid documents.
- 13. No admission, whatsoever, shall be made after the due date.
- 14. All admissions will be as per admission schedule notified by H.P. University from time to time.
- 15. All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of Vice Chancellor, HPU Shimla-5.
- 16. All the fee and funds are to be deposited within the stipulated time period.

Note: If a candidate does not deposit fees within the stipulated time period, his/her admission will be deemed cancelled.

Important: The students, who are required to produce affidavits for admission, must consult the admission committee about the contents/statement to be given in the affidavit so that any inconvenience at later stage may be avoided. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.

5.3 Counseling

- Online admission will not guarantee admission to the College, unless the candidate produces all original certificates and documents (uploaded while applying for admission) at the time of physical verification during the counseling.
- Counseling in physical mode will be organized for first year students on 22nd July 2024 (tentative).
- 3. Students must be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the counseling.

5.4 Migration

Migration from any other College to Govt. Degree College, Darlaghat or vice-versa is governed by H.P. University rules. Fees and funds will be charged from student as per Govt and University rules. **PTA Fee is not refundable in any case.**

6. DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

- 1. Matriculation certificate for Date of Birth.
- 2. 10+2 markssheet.

3. H.P. Bonafide certificate for girl students (for exemption in tuition fee).

4. Minimum 40% disability certificate and category certificate in case of students seeking admission against these seats.

5. Original character certificate from Head of the Institution last attended. In case of private candidates, the character certificate must have been issued by a Gazetted officer/ Panchayat Pradhan/ Ward Counsellor but not older than 6 months from the day of submission of admission form.

6. For seat against the single girl child category 'an Affidavit proclaiming the same from the parents is to be submitted with the admission form.

7. A student seeking admission from Board/University other than H.P. will have to upload the copy of migration certificate and the original certificate has to be submitted at the time of counseling.

8 A candidate having a gap of one or more years in his/her studies will have to submit an affidavit issued by court only, explaining the reasons thereof.

9. Certificate of SC/ ST from Magistrate Class-1 (Authorised Signatory) should be provided by those seeking relaxation in age/ marks.

10. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of the applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence / affidavit as proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap.

NOTE:

- i. Every student must have his/her own e-mail ID.
- ii. Parents must ensure the entry of their Mobile No. in the admission form in order to make it convenient to send them important messages.

IMPORTANT: STUDENTS MUST REMEMBER THEIR USER ID, E-MAIL ID, PASSWORD AND REGISTERED MOBILE NUMBERS FOR FUTURE REFERENCE/USE.

7. NUMBER OF SEATS AVAILABLE AND RESERVATION OF SEATS

- 1. For admission to first year in each subject, as First Elective, total number of available seats will be 120.
- 2. However, the number of seats in Elective II for B.A. I students will also be restricted depending upon the availability of faculty and infrastructure.

Important: All admissions will be made as per the reservation criteria of the state government and university roaster in this regard except when under application received.

Note:

- A candidate has to choose two subjects from the above list, as DSC I and DSC II. Both DSC I and DSCII cannot be opted from the same group. For example: If a candidate opts for Political Science as DSC I from Group II; any subject from Group 1, Group III may be chosen as DSC II.
- Choosing subjects/courses by a candidate does not guarantee admission to a particular course. Admission of a candidate will be purely on merit basis.
- Students taking admission in BA First Year will have to study the following eight courses:

9. REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. A candidate expelled by any college/university or found involved in any act of indiscipline in the preceding year(s) will not be admitted to the college.

2. The students having compartment in 10+2 class are not eligible for admission.

3. Any candidate who has not appeared/passed in English as a subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission to B.A. I year.

4. If a student gets admission by furnishing incorrect information or by concealing facts, his /her admission will be cancelled on detection of such fault by the college/ university.

5. The Principal reserves the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student, or to expel/ suspend him/her, without assigning any reason(s) or explanations, if situation so warrants.

6. Failed students of other colleges will not be admitted.

10. COURSE DESIGN/ STRUCTURE OF B.A./B.Com

The subject wise syllabus and design of BA and B.Com is available on given link https://hpuniv.ac.in/syllabus.php

10.1 Award of Degree

1. An undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective Papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective papers.

2. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in the college for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years), and shall have to pass the examinations prescribed and fulfil such conditions as have been prescribed thereof.

3. For the degree (B.A./B. Com.), the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission

10.2 Accumulation of Credits & Evaluation System

1. Accumulation of Credits

A student will have to accumulate 132 credits for a bachelor's degree over a minimum of three and maximum of five years from the date of admission. For the successful completion of a course, a student is required to obtain minimum 35% marks separately in CCA & Term End Examination & at least 40% marks in aggregate of Term End Examination & CCA.

2. Evaluation System

Evaluation System has the following components:

- **a. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):** It will account for 30% of the final grade which is further distributed as follows:
 - Classroom Attendance: A student has to attend a minimum of 75 % lectures/tutorials and practical failing which he/ she will not be allowed to appear in End Terms Examinations. The incentive for classroom attendance is:

75% but <80%	1 Marks
80% but <85%	2 Marks
85% but <90%	3 Marks
90% but <95%	4 Marks
More than 95%	5 Marks

- ii) House Examination: There will be one House Examination in each year and one class test of 10 and 5 marks respectively.
- iii) Seminar/ Assignment/Term Paper: The remaining 10 marks will be awarded on the basis of seminar/ assignment /term papers.

b. Term End Examination: The 70% of the final grade for in a course will be on the basis of Annual Examinations of 3 hours duration covering the whole syllabus.

NOTE: Only those students will be eligible to appear in the Term End Examination who have passed in CCA.

Important excerpt from proceedings of Deans/Chairpersons and Directors of various teaching departments/bodies of HP University, Shimla dated 13th June 2018 regarding passing examinations and award of degree (for annual system)

"A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subject/papers and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/she will appear in the subject/paper in which he/she got the compartment. He/she will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage), available to him to clear his/her compartment in subjects/papers. He/she will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her courses within five years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year."

10.3 Change of subject/faculty

Change of subject/faculty is allowed only once and that too in the first year within 15 days of the commencement of teaching provided:

- He/she fulfils eligibility criteria
- Seats are available in the concerned subject

Hence, a student is expected to be very careful while exercising the option for the first time in order to save himself from inconvenience later.

Note: Change of subject combination without the approval of Head of the Institution on prescribed proforma will not be entertained and such change in final examinations will not be considered. Students will be personally responsible for such acts

11. GENERAL CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE RULES

All the students must note that ragging inside/ outside the college campus or on roads leading to college is a cognizable offence. In addition, any of the following activities will be considered a breach of discipline:

a) Graffiti, i.e. any sort of writing on the walls/ blackboards/ rooms, etc.

- b) Damaging the college property in any manner.
- c) Loitering about the corridors and causing disturbance to the classes.

d) Possession or use of drugs and indulgence in smoking or drinking in and around the campus.

e) Bringing outsiders to the college.

f) Sticking any kind of bills/notice on the notice board without the prior permission of the Principal.

g) Creating any kind of violence or nuisance in the campus.

h) Coming to the college without I-Card.

i) Use of the mobile phones in and around the classroom(s) and Examination-Hall(s).

[Use of the mobile phones by the students in and around the classroom(s) and Examination-Hall(s) is strictly prohibited.]

Caution

i) Strict action will be taken against the student found guilty of breaching conduct or discipline rules in the College campus.

ii) Defaulters including students whose names have been struck off the roll(s) will not be allowed to enter the College premises until exonerated or readmitted appropriately.

12. ATTENDANCE

1. At least 75% Lecture attendance is compulsory to be eligible for appearing in the Term End Examination of HPU.

2. The name of an irregular student, or one who remains absent continuously for 10 days from the College/any elective subject, will be struck-off from the College rolls. If the name of a student is struck-off twice, he/she shall not be readmitted to the College. It may be noted that admission/readmission to the College is not the right of any student/candidate.

3. A student is liable to pay all dues and fines as long as his/her name remains on the College rolls.

13. LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

1. It is compulsory for all the students to get their leave sanctioned from Dean of the Faculty, before proceeding on any kind of leave.

2. For leave on medical grounds extending more than a week, the student will be required to submit a medical certificate in case the leave is for more than a week's duration.

3. Leave up to one week will be sanctioned by the Dean of the Faculty. For leave extending more than one week's duration, the student shall have to apply to the Principal.

4. A student will not be allowed to avail more than 10 days leave during the entire academic session, except under exceptional circumstances.

5. If a student is regularly skipping classes or does not submit assignments, his/her name will be struck off from the rolls of the College.

6. Even if a student is on leave, he/she will have to deposit his/her fee as per the scheduled dates decided by the College.

7. The students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within three days after the name is struck off after paying a fine of `100/- and a fine of 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within 10 days after the name is struck off from the rolls.

14. LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Library will be open from 10A.M. to 5 P.M. on all working days.
- 2. Students shall be permitted to keep books for a period of two weeks.
- 3. A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged from the student for keeping books beyond the period of two weeks.
- 4. The faculty members can borrow four books at a time.
- Library books will be issued to a student only on the production of duly signed student's identity-cum-Library Card.
- 6. A student will be responsible for all the books issued to him or her on the card even if the card is lost.
- 7. Marking, underlining or writing on library books is strictly forbidden
- The loss of the Identity-cum-Library card should be immediately reported to the librarian.
 A duplicate one will be issued on a prescribed fee.

- 9. Any borrower, who loses, defaces or in any way damages a library book, shall be liable to pay the current price of the book.
- 10. A 'No Dues Certificate' by each student is to be obtained from the librarian while withdrawing any student from the college.
- 11. A perfect order and silence shall be maintained in the library at all times.

15. ID CARD

Every Student will be issued an identity Card. Since I-Card is the only medium to identity/differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always carry it with him/her. Otherwise, he/she will be considered an outsider and action will be taken.

• If the I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after a FIR is registered with the nearest police station and original copy thereof is appended with such a request.

• The actual cost of the card will be charged for issuance of a duplicate Identity Card.

4.Bank Charges/commission payable for online payment will be borne by the student only.

5. Library Security Rs. 100/- is payable by the student on migration from other college affiliated from HPU.

6. The above fees and funds are subject to change as per HPU/HP Government instructions.

7. Refund and Transfer of Fee will be regulated as per GoHP, HPU and UGC Regulation. However, PTA Fee once paid will not be refunded.

17. FINES & PENALTIES

- 1. If a student does not pay her/his dues by the notified dates, her/ his name will be struck off the College rolls at the end of the month.
- 2. A student's name will be struck off if she/he is absent without sanctioned leave for 10 or more consecutive days.
- 3. If a student's name is struck off, she /he must be accompanied by a parent or guardian for readmission.
- 4. Students must seek readmission within seven days after her/his name is struck off.
- 5. Students must obtain a no-dues certificate from the College, Library, concerned Department, N.S.S., Sports, and Fee Clerk if they wish to leave the College.
- 6. Library security will be forfeited if a student does not apply for a refund within one year of leaving the college.

29.2 Anti-Smoking/Anti-Intoxicant Warning

Smoking and the use of intoxicants are strictly prohibited on campus. Violators will face fines or expulsion, and the matter will be reported to the police.

29.3 Notice of Annual General House of PTA

Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) of the College was constituted on 26th August, 2017 with the objective of promoting a dialogue between parents and teachers for the holistic development of students. Parents are requested to attend the Annual General House of the PTA

to be scheduled in the second week of September 2024. In General House, PTA Executive is elected every year in the beginning of academic session. RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE

Ragging is a criminal offence and any student found involved in ragging in any form whatsoever, will be punished stringently. Ragging in and around the college or on roads/ approaches leading thereto is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under rule 22.17 (a) (b) (c) of H. P. University to expel the guilty and report the matter to the police as ragging amounts to a criminal offence.
